Papers

24 Papers were assigned to the committee. Each paper had at least 3 reviews with one having 7. In all, 100 reviews were completed averaging 4.17 reviews per paper. In terms of reviewers, approximately 61 different people were tapped and I tried to keep the number of reviews per person to 2. Overall, the committee accepted 5 papers for presentation and publication and 2 additional papers for presentation only. The acceptance rate was 29 percent for presentation and 21 percent for publication.

Last years papers have been published and are in Research Record 1870. There are 21 papers in the Research Record.

Officially we have 3 sessions in the TRB program. Unofficially we had a strong hand in the development of the Travel Data Users Forum that was held this morning. In fact our members dominated the program. Thinking about the forum I would be interested in hearing what your thoughts on it were.

Special Events

Data for Reauthorization Conference—The group working on this conference has temporarily suspended its meetings. Tom Palmerlee has placed us on the TRB calendar for next November but for now we have to see how things will play out.

Midyear Meeting—was held at NATMEC in San Diego this past June. We had about 10 members and 13 non members present. We talked quite a bit about planning for this year's annual meeting and many of the activities you will hear about today. One major item of significance was the establishment of a Subcommittee on Research being organized by Catherine Lawson and Stacey Bricka who will give us their own report later in the meeting.

North American Travel Monitoring and Exposition Conference (June 27 – 30)—The committee was involved in the conference planning and took a very active role in the development of the program. Shawn Turner organized a session on Archived ITS Data quality, Rich Margiotta one on ADUS Standards and Metadata, Mark Schlappi on Measuring Urban Traffic Congestion and I did one on HPMS and building Partnerships Around VMT. The committee is again involved with the organization of the 2006 NATMEC through both I and Catherine Lawson.

National Household Travel Survey Conference (October 31 – November 2)— This past fall over 130 transportation professionals at the federal, state, and local levels, as well as for academics and other transportation researchers gathered to

- Discuss how the 2002 National Household Travel Survey (NHTS) was being use in investigations of critical areas for transportation policy
- Learn innovative applications of the data to understand and estimate travel behavior
- Provide input on the design of future national household travel surveys
- Identify emerging trends and data needs that should be reflected in future survey efforts
- Discover data sources that complement the NHTS data in providing a more complete picture of travel behavior in the United States.

The summary report for the conference National Household Travel Survey Conference: Data for Understanding Our Nation's Travel will be posted on the conference web site http://www.TRB.org/Conferences/NHTS this week. The papers and presentations are already posted there. The short report, summarizes key point from the day and a half program that combined

- Overviews of current and future survey plans
- Paper sessions reported both used of NHTS data and methodological issues
- Workshops anchored by resource papers where key issues were explored
- Key observations on the conference by Dr. Joseph Schofer of Northwestern University

Transferability of Household Travel Surveys Peer Exchange (December 16)-On December 16 at the Keck Center in Washington DC, the FHWA TMIP Office and several TRB committees including ABJ30 sponsored a peer exchange on the values, pitfalls, and research needs relating to sharing travel survey data

between regions. The discussion began with "borrowing" typical model parameters and moved to focus on whether it is appropriate to transfer fundamental data such as the trips and activity patterns of survey households and individuals. Participants included university researchers and leading practitioners from State DOTs, MPOs, and consultancies. A summary report with research recommendations will be published shortly. To support the activities of the peer exchange and to further the concepts of transferability a website of current research has been established at http://www.edthefed.com/xferability/.

In addition to this, I have also been developing a draft Problem Statement calling for the update of NCHRP 365 to be placed in the NCHRP problem statement hopper this summer. I trust that the committee would support just such an effort.

NCHRP—Project number 8-37, Standardized Procedures for Personal Travel Surveys with Peter Stopher as the lead is finish up and I believe will be talked about at the Survey Methods (ABJ40) Committee meeting on Wednesday.

Another project, 8-48, Using American Community Survey Data for Transportation Planning is one in which this committee played a key role in promoting and is following very closely. Cambridge Systematics is the lead consultant and they will be discussing the project at our American Community Survey session Tuesday afternoon. This project leads into a major conference we are involved with this May. (distribute flyer).

Midyear Meeting(s)—This year I am planning two midyear meetings. A West coast and an East coast one. The West coast meeting will be in Irvine California coupled to the Census conference. The East coast meeting will be coupled to the larger TRB Joint Summer Meeting in Boston, July 10-12, 2005.
