

## Call for Research Papers

**Select Subject Areas:** Society, Policy, Planning and Forecasting



The Health and Transportation Subcommittee of the Transportation Research Board seeks research papers expanding our understanding and evaluation of public health and transportation. **We welcome papers that are based on critical thinking and add to the growing body of knowledge with concepts, principles, theories, methodologies, and applications in the area of health and transportation.**

Examples of research questions of interest to this call may include, but are not limited to:

- Development or application of emerging technologies, tools or data in better evaluating transportation-based health outcomes.
- Innovative use of theoretical frameworks in practical applications to improve our understanding of the links between transportation and health.
- Methods and models that help improve our knowledge of diverse impacts and issues related to health with respect to vulnerable populations.
- Identification, evaluation, and resolution of challenges in communication and coordination across health and transportation sectors.
- Feasible and effective approaches to maximizing health benefits and addressing potential adverse impacts of transportation planning and policy decisions.
- Quantification of health impacts and benefits of transportation actions and policies.

**Submission for papers for publication and/or presentation is now open and must be completed by August 1, 2020.** Submission of complete papers, conforming to TRB standards and format, is required for consideration. Papers may be submitted for publication or presentation only. Each paper will be peer-reviewed according to TRB procedures.
